

## ILP Housing Program Differences

*Participation is a Privilege*

### IL Subsidy vs. Chafee Housing

Category	Subsidy (aka ILSP)	Chafee Housing
Service Category and Type	ILP Subsidy Placement; Youth on Housing Subsidy - Placement Tracking	ILP Housing Services; Chafee Housing – Monthly (entered by Central Office ILP Desk)
Payment Method	Central Office ILP Desk as a one-time payment	Central Office ILP Desk as a one-time payment.
Minimum Age	16	18
DHS care & custody	Required	Prohibited - Foster Care must be terminated on or after 18 <sup>th</sup> birthday
DHS or Tribal	DHS youth only	DHS & Tribal youth
Employment	Optional	Must be employed at least part-time
Medical Card	Provided by child welfare	Youth must apply for Former Foster Care Youth Medical Program
Duration	12 month maximum	\$6,000 or age 21, whichever comes first
Monthly Expenses	Can pay for any monthly expense (transportation, clothing, etc.)	Can only pay for room and board (rent, food, utilities)
ETV or ETG	OK to use simultaneously	No, if room and board included in cost of attendance
Funding Source	State General Funds	Federal Chafee ILP Grant Funds

**Note:** Youth wanting Chafee Housing can come back to DHS Child Welfare on a Voluntary Services basis (complete a **CF 304 – Service Application**). In most cases, a new case number is assigned with youth listed as the adult on the case.

\*\* Both programs require a youth to be participating in **40 hours of productive activity per week** (employment/education or combination, up to 15 hours of volunteerism allowed).

\*\* Both programs require the youth to be **enrolled in ILP Skill Building Services**.
