Foster Youth Resources and Services

Learn about the services available to foster youth through DHS and the Independent Living Program (ILP). The foster youth you work with may be eligible for housing subsidies, funds for miscellaneous expenses (application fees, college tours, computers for school, start-up kits for the dorms, etc.), medical coverage to age 26, and other supports from your local ILP Provider. The question and answer session, along with handouts, will allow you to walk away from this workshop with indepth knowledge of the ILP services and how to help foster youth access supports.
