Financial Aid Senior Checklist It's important to become familiar with the financial aid process at the beginning of your senior year so you don't overlook or miss important deadlines!

Achieve

- ☐ Finish Strong: Maintain grades and school attendance. Keep taking rigorous courses.
- Admissions Alert: Acceptance can be conditional, so continue your academic excellence.

Practice Organization:

- Professional Email: Create and check it regularly for college and employment applications.
- Use a calendar (physical or digital) for deadlines, assignments, events, and activities.
- \circ $\;$ Set digital reminders for important deadlines.
- Create physical and digital file systems for college planning documents.
- Keep copies of applications and essays.
- Create files for each school application and scholarship.
- Save all versions of essays for potential reuse.

AP/IB Exams: Prepare for and take these exams.

Explore

- **Career Exploration:** Don't stress about not knowing your future career yet. Future college courses are a great way to explore interests.
- College Search: Finalize your list using resources like <u>Oregon Goes to College</u> and <u>BigFuture</u>.
- **Build Resume and Leadership Skills:** Look for opportunities to enhance your resume.

Engage

- **Review Plans:** Regularly review your transcript and college plans with your high school counselor, ASPIRE Coordinator/ Mentor, and family.
- Utilize ASPIRE Resources: Visit your ASPIRE/College Coordinator for help with applications, scholarships, and financial aid.
- **Request Recommendations:** Ask teachers, coaches, and community leaders for letters of recommendation, allowing them at least 2-4 weeks to complete.



Prepare

Admissions and Scholarship Essays: Write engaging and personal essays. Get help from <u>College Board's Big Future</u> .
Financial Aid Applications: Complete FAFSA or ORSAA following the steps using <u>How to pay for college Checklist</u> FAFSA and <u>ORSAA Tips form</u> <u>English/Spanish</u> .
Scholarship Applications:
 OSAC Scholarship opens November 1.
 Look for other scholarships at colleges, through your ASPIRE/College
Coordinator, high school counselor, and search platforms like <u>College</u>
Board Scholarships, FastWeb, JLV College Counseling, Oregon Goes to College and Scholarships.com.
College Fit: Finalize your list of colleges (5 - 7 schools with at least one Oregon
Community College).
 Research admissions requirements, costs, scholarships, programs, and student activities.
 Compare and rank colleges based on your priorities.
College Entrance Exams: Register and take/re-take SAT/ACT in the fall. • Talk to your counselor about possible test dates at school.
Portfolios/Auditions: Finalize materials if required.
Essay Feedback: Get feedback from teachers, ASPIRE coordinator, mentor, or college advisors.
Check Email & College Portals: Regularly check for additional information from colleges and scholarship committees.
Mid-Year Transcripts: Send to colleges that request them.
Compare Financial Aid Offers: Assess and find ways to cover any gaps in your financial aid.

Plan

- Attend Events: Mark calendars for career and college events, workshops, and programs.
- **Submit Applications:** Finalize and submit college admissions and scholarship applications by deadlines.
- **Follow-Up:** Ensure colleges receive all required information (transcripts, resumes, recommendations).
- □ Oregon Promise: <u>Apply</u> (GPA 2.0+) whether community college is your 1st plan, or a back-up plan, all are encouraged to apply.
- College Choice: Notify and place a deposit at your chosen college by National College Decision Day, May 1.



- **Final Transcript:** Request it to be sent to your chosen college.
- AP/IB Scores: Send to your final college choice.
- **Placement Tests:** Check if your college requires them.
- **College Portal:** Regularly check for important updates.
- **Orientation:** Register and attend summer/fall orientation if required.
- Budget and Housing:
 - Plan your finances and housing arrangements.
 - Complete roommate surveys, residence life contracts, and submit housing deposits.
 - Submit health forms, including required immunizations/vaccines.
- **Create a Budget:** Work with family to plan financially.
- **Travel Arrangements:** Plan affordable travel for orientation and move-in.
- **Job:** Save for college and build your resume.
- **Packing:** Refer to your college's checklist if living on campus.
- **Quality Time:** Spend summer with family and friends; set communication expectations for college.
- **Express Gratitude:** Thank your family and supportive adults who helped along the way.
- Celebrate: Take time to celebrate your achievements and the hard work that got you here. Enjoy this milestone with family and friends!
