	Track Activities: Use <u>ASPIRE/OSAC Activities Chart</u> for clubs, activities, community service, and paid work. Keep detailed records.
	Build Professional Skills: Take courses in MS Office, Google Suite, Adobe Creative Suite, and improve typing speed and email etiquette.
	Plan for Recommendations: Identify potential recommenders and interact positively with them.
	Create Resume: List activities, volunteer work, and jobs. Review with ASPIRE mentor or counselor.
	Draft Essays: Write application and scholarship essays. Get feedback from trusted mentors or teachers.
	Plan: to request recommendation letters early in senior year.
	Summer Plans: Consider jobs, volunteer opportunities, and camps to enhance your resume.

	 College Entrance Exams: Ask your counselor for upcoming dates Fall: Register for PSAT/NMSQT and review results with your counselor. Spring: Register for SAT and/or ACT. Consider the ASVAB test for career exploration. Testing Tip: Juniors should consider testing in Spring to allow time for possible retake.
	Student Athletes: Register for the NCAA Eligibility Center or NAIA Eligibility Center and ensure you meet curriculum requirements. Coaches, Counselors, and Athletic Directors are great resources for student athletes.
	Financial Aid: Learn about options to pay for college with resources like OSAC webinars and connect with ASPIRE Coordinator/Mentor.

	 Start and organize a scholarship list and note deadlines. Summer is a great time to explore OSAC scholarships and get a head start on personal statements and create an OSAC test application.
